Songlines Performance



Throughout the spring and summer terms, we have been working in collaboration with Dorchester Arts and Dorset Museum on an exciting project involving all of the Year 4 children within DASP.

In the spring term, the children all visited the Dorset Museum and researched the geological history of Dorset in the Natural Dorset gallery. They then worked with local composer, Geof Edge, to create a series of songs all about the changing Dorset landscape. Songs had titles such as "Triassic Dorset is a Desert", "Across the Tundra", and "Through the Jungle".

Together with Geof Edge, Mrs Trevorrow then worked with the children to rehearse the songs. The project culminated in a performance in Maumbury Rings on Saturday 18th June with over 200 children and over 60 adults taking part.

The whole project was such a lovely experience for the children to not only rehearse and perform, but to also experience the composition process from initial ideas, through to completed works.

Summer Concert 2022



On Sunday 3rd July, over 200 students from across DASP took part in the DASP Summer Concert at Weymouth Pavilion. This year, many performance groups collaborated and once such group was the large-scale joint orchestra of children from Year 1 to Year 13 who performed The Toreador Song from Carmen. There was also a massed choir of students from across DASP who performed Put a Little Love in your Heart and Everybody Needs Somebody, accompanied by a live



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band, as the finale of the performance.

It was so wonderful to see the children performing music together in an inside venue again and I hope that this is the start of things returning to normality. A huge thanks to all of the staff involved in preparing the students for the performance and to those who were there on the day.
