Personal, Social & Emotional Development

Talk about feelings and emotions.

Mathematics

Number:

Counts objects to 10 and then to 20 accurately.

Uses the language of 'more' and 'fewer' to compare two sets of objects.

Finds the total number of items in two groups by counting all of them.

Says the number that is one more than a given number. Begins to understand and use number bonds within 10. Early addition and subtraction.

Mathematics

Pattern:

Recognises pattern in the environment.

Can talk about pattern and recognise a unit of repeat. Can copy simple patterns. Can continue simple patterns. Can create simple patterns of their own.

Shape:

Can describe and name 2D shapes.

People & Communities

Children talk about past and present events in their own lives and in the lives of family members.

They know that other children don't always enjoy the same things, and are sensitive to this. They know about similarities and differences between themselves and others, and among families, communities and traditions.

They talk about what it means to be part of Forest Class and part of Piddle Valley School.

The World

Children know where they live and can talk about their home. They make observations of animals and plants and explain why some things occur, and talk about changes.

They represent their own ideas, thoughts and feelings through design and technology, art, music, dance, role play and stories.

They act out stories using Talk 4 Writing actions.

Year 1 Specific Phonics and Reading:

- Respond speedily with the correct sound to graphemes (letters or groups of letters) for all 40+ phonemes, including, where applicable, alternative sounds for grapheme.
- Read accurately by blending sounds in unfamiliar words containing GPCs that have been taught.
- Read common exception words, noting unusual correspondences between spelling and sound and where these occur in the word
- Read words containing taught GPCs and -s, -es, -ing, -ed, -er and -est endings.
- Read other words of more than one syllable that contain taught GPCs.
- Read words with contractions [for example, I'm, I'll, we'll], and understand that the apostrophe represents the omitted letter(s).
- Read books aloud, accurately, that are consistent with their developing phonic knowledge and that do not require them to use other strategies to work out words.
- Re-read these books to build up their fluency and confidence in word reading.

The phonics screening check is taken individually by all children in Year 1 in England, and is usually taken in June. It is designed to give teachers and parents information on how your child is progressing in phonics. It will help to identify whether your child needs additional support at this stage so that they do not fall behind in this vital early reading skill.

Science

Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.
